Saint Michael's Abbey is a Benedictine abbey in Farnborough. The small community is known for the quality of its liturgy, which is sung in Latin and Gregorian Chant, its pipe organ, and its liturgical publishing and printing. It is also the national shrine of St Joseph. The Abbey was founded in 1881 by the Empress Eugénie (1826–1920) as a mausoleum for her late husband Napoleon III (1808–1873), and their son the Prince Imperial (1856–1879), both of whom rest in the Imperial Crypt, along with Eugénie herself, all in granite sarcophagi provided by Queen Victoria. Every Saturday at 3 pm there is a guided tour of the Abbey Church and Imperial Crypt. There is no need to book in advance. The Abbey gates open automatically at 2.50 pm – please wait at the gates until they open. The tour lasts an hour and ends in the monastery shop. We ask a minimum donation of £3 per person (children free).
