

Volunteers in Rushmoor making a major economic contribution to the local community!



Rushmoor Voluntary Services (RVS) has identified that there are at least **3554** volunteers giving their time in the borough contributing an estimated **£7.1m** to the local economy annually!



In a recent survey, Rushmoor Volunteer Centre asked its members how many volunteers were involved with their work. Over 60* organisations responded, including large charities, community and voluntary organisations and small community based projects. (**this represents around 15% of RVS' membership*)

From our questionnaire the number of volunteers involved in the work of 60 Rushmoor based organisations was: 3554. Using a nationally recognised formula and salary scales for our area, we calculated that the work of these 3554 volunteers contributes *£7.1 million to the Rushmoor economy annually! (ivo.org.uk and SE pay scales).

We will continue to work together with partners in the community to enable local people to participate in volunteering. We also want to give local organisations the help they need to recruit more people to help them to make a difference in the community'.

Rushmoor Voluntary Services provides support and information to local voluntary groups and volunteers. Rushmoor Volunteer Centre works with other organisations to place people into local volunteering. This is done through face-to-face meetings, enquiries received through a volunteering database, telephone and website enquiries. Using these methods, the centre placed at least 261 people into voluntary work during 2017/18.
