Latest Funds

Open Philanthropy Fund – Tackling Financial Hardship Funds

One-off grants for small charities and other not-for-profit organisations that are supporting local communities in the UK who are facing financial hardship over the next six months. Test Valley - Cost of Living Grants

The William and Jane Morris Fund

Grants of up to £5,000 are available to churches, chapels and other places of worship for the conservation of decorative features and monuments, but not for structural repairs.

Only buildings or monuments erected before 1896 are eligible. Please [CLICK HERE](#) to find out more.

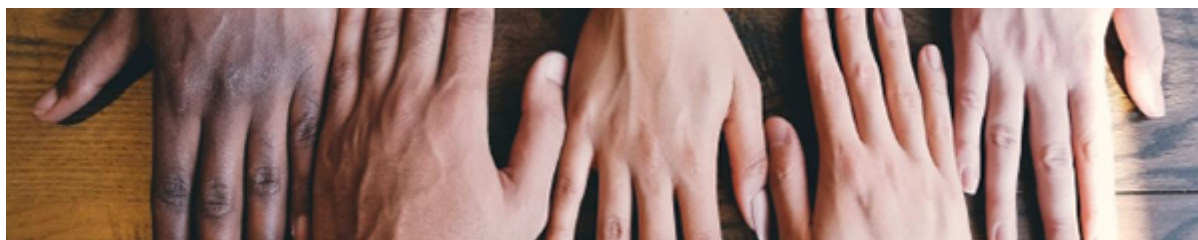
Steel Charitable Trust

The trust awards funding in five core categories, including Arts and Heritage, and Education. Grant size ranges from £10,000 up to £25,000. There are four funding rounds each year. Please [CLICK HERE](#) to find out more.

McCarthy Stone Foundation - Connecting at Christmas

Thames Water Trust Fund - Organisational Grant Programme

A small number of grants are available to registered charities, voluntary organisations and not-for-profit organisation in the Thames Water geographical area to fund money advice/financial literacy projects that encourage financial stability and promote competent money management. The funding aims to assist the setting up of new and innovative projects to support children and their welfare. The focus is exclusively on children (with a cut-off age of 18) and wherever possible where the direct benefit to children can be easily observed.

Children in Need – Core Costs Funding

Available to not-for-profit organisations working with children and young people aged 18 or under with a priority for smaller local organisations, with a turnover of less than £1M. Grants of up to £2,200 are available to smaller community organisations that provide activities where children can learn and have fun without it costing them or

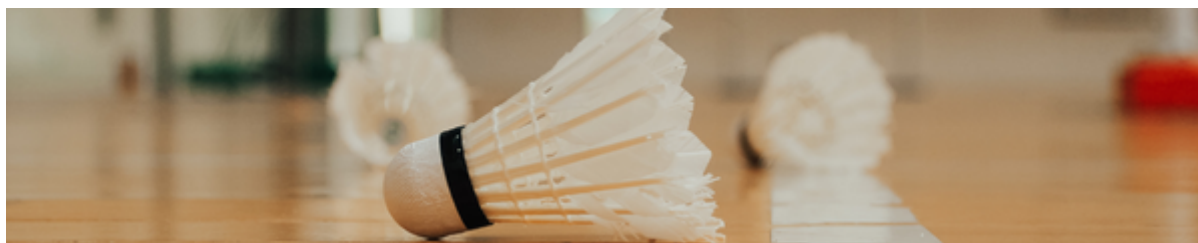
Lloyd's of London Foundation Charity Partnerships
