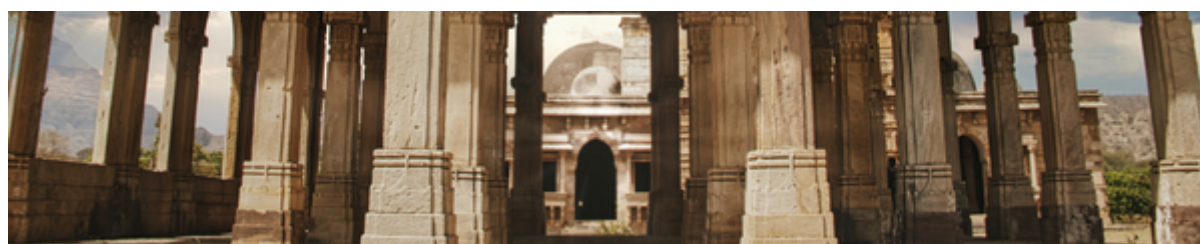

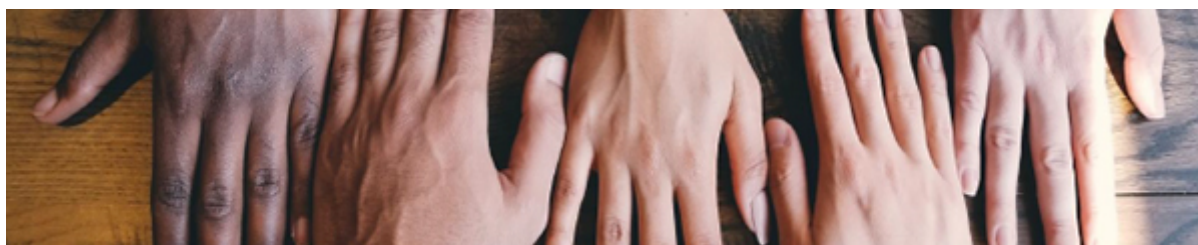
Churchcare

We'll only accept small grant applications from UK registered charities with a turnover of less than £1 million. Last date for applications is Monday 20 February. This programme is open to national and local charities helping disadvantaged children and young people to overcome the challenges they face. Charities can apply for a small or large grant, depending on their income. Grants of up to £5,000 per year are unrestricted, whereas larger grants are restricted to a specified project. FCC Community Action Fund (England)

Registered charities, churches, parish councils, local authorities and CASC registered sports clubs can apply for grants of between £2,000 and £100,000 for the provision, maintenance or improvement of community facilities. The funding is being made available through the FCC Community Action Fund and is available to projects located within 10 miles of an eligible FCC Environment site. Next deadline: 8th March 2023. 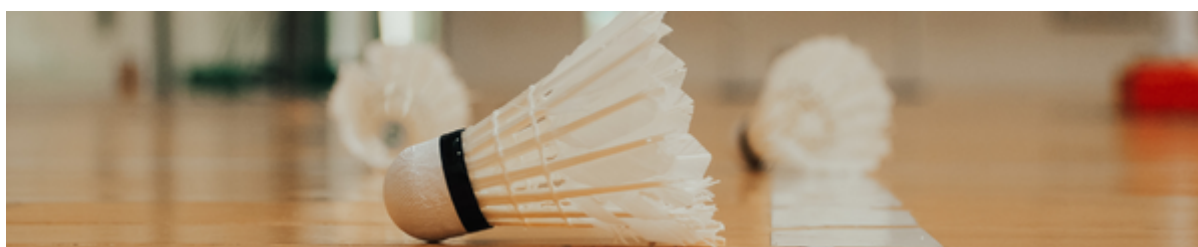
Wolfson Foundation – Funding for Places
