Latest Funds

Magic Little Grants

Magic Little Grants is open for applications again from the 1st March. Not-for-profit groups and organisations must be in their first year of operation or have an annual income under £250,000 in order to apply for a one-off grant of £500. Association for Industrial Archaeology - Restoration Grants

Funding is available for the restoration of historically, technically, architecturally, and/or archaeologically important industrial buildings, structures, machinery, vehicles and vessels within the UK. Fidelio Charitable Trust

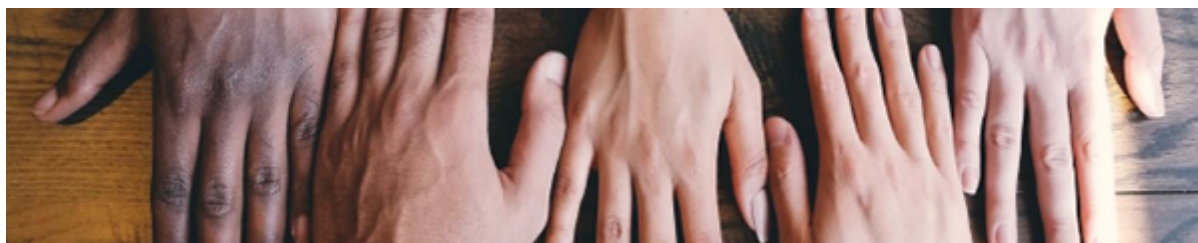

Community Ownership Fund

Grants are available to voluntary, community and charitable organisations in the UK to support them in taking ownership of local assets such as pubs, theatres and parks which are at risk of being lost to the community.
