Latest Funds

CUF - Supporting Refugees in England

The Church Urban Fund looks to support local churches as they continue to help refugees arriving in England from Ukraine and Afghanistan. Churches and Christian charities can apply for funding between £500 and £5,000. The closing date for applications is Friday 31st of March. Please **CLICK HERE** to find out more.

Arts, Culture & Heritage



Youth Music Trailblazer Fund

Grants of up to £30,000 are available to organisations in England for projects that support children and young people facing barriers to make, learn and earn in music. Organisations less than one year old can apply for up to £15,000. A minimum of 10%

Golsoncott Foundation

Voluntary sector organisations in the UK whose focus is primarily on the arts can apply for funding. Grants tend to be between £250 and £3,000 with most in the £500 to £1,000 range. The Trustees' overriding concern is to support those projects that demonstrate and deliver excellence in the arts, be it in performance, exhibition, artistic craft, or scholarly endeavour. The Headley Trust

Funding for registered charities in the UK for projects in a range of areas including arts and heritage, and work on cathedrals and major churches. Please **CLICK HERE** to find out more.

Health & Social Welfare



Britford Bridge Trust

Grants are available to UK registered charities involved in the prevention or relief of poverty; the advancement of education; the advancement of health or the saving of lives; and the advancement of the arts, culture, heritage or science. Please CLICK HERE to find out more.

Randal Charitable Foundation

The foundation provides funding to charities working within a wide range of themes including health issues, mental health, poverty and social disadvantage. Both small scale-grants (under £3,000) and larger-scale grants are available. Please **CLICK HERE** to find out more.

Kennedy Leigh Charitable Trust

The trust offers grants for charitable organisations undertaking projects in the UK or Israel around the themes of education, health, culture, relief of poverty and advancement of human rights. Funding is at the discretion of the Trustees. Previous grants have ranged between £1,000 and £30,000. Funding is available for capital projects and running costs. Environment



New Forest National Park - Sustainable Communities Fund

The aim of the fund is to strengthen the wellbeing and sustainability of communities within the National Park through improving opportunities for wildlife and habitats. Schemes to reduce carbon emissions, and connecting new groups to nature. Please **CLICK HERE** to find out more.

Alpkit Foundation

The Foundation makes small awards to local groups and schools that work to remove the barriers in getting outdoors and experiencing wild places, encouraging participation, education, conservation and protection of the natural environment.

Urban Tree Challenge Fund

The Fund will now provide 80% funding of standard costs for planting large trees and their establishment costs for three years following planting, thereby now only requiring 20% match-funding by the recipient in either money or labour. Applications will be accepted from public bodies, community groups, charities and non-government organisations, individuals and private companies in England, who must have full management control over the land or signed consent from those who do. The Henry Smith Charity

Grants ranging from £500 to £2,750 are available for schools, youth groups, non-profit organisations, and charities to support recreational trips or holidays within the UK for groups of disadvantaged or disabled children who are 13 years old or younger.
