McCarthy Stone Foundation – Christmas Connection 2023

The Christmas Connections programme is all about connecting older adults over the Christmas period. Grants of up to £1,000 will be available to support organisations running activities for people over 65 in their community over the festive period.

Local Authority

Basingstoke and Deane - UK Shared Prosperity Fund: Pride in Place Fund

Grants are intended to support charitable organisations in Basingstoke and Deane with the delivery of projects that have clear social and economic benefits for residents and communities of the borough and demonstrate that they respond to a community need. Organisations/groups that have previously received or are receiving grant funding from Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council can apply to this scheme as long as the funding sought is for a new and different project. Grants are for capital and revenue funding and applicants can apply for one or both. The deadline for applications is 19th November 2023 (23.59pm). Please [CLICK HERE](#) to find out more.

New Forest - Community Grants

Revenue and capital grants are available to help voluntary and community organisations in their provision of activities and services to benefit local people, and to carry out capital projects within New Forest District.

Two grants are available:

- Capital grants of between £1,000 and £100,000. The Council will award a grant of up to 50% of the project's total cost.
- Revenue grants of between £1,000 and £35,000 with payment made from 1 April 2024.

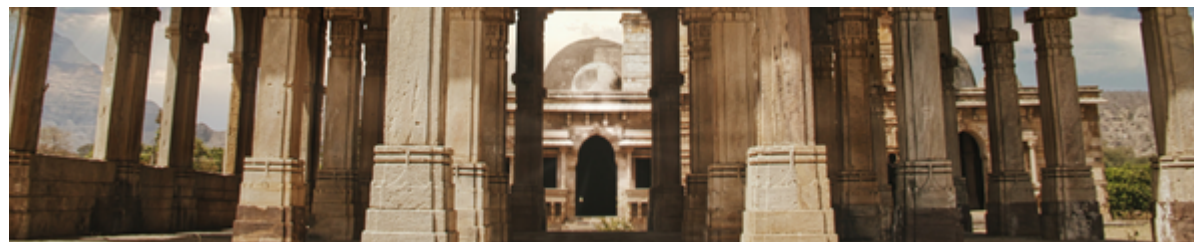

The Aurelius Charitable Trust

Grants are available for charitable organisations involved with conservation of culture inherited from the past and the dissemination of knowledge, particularly in the humanities field. Funding is not available for administration or operational costs, but for costs associated with eligible projects. The application process is ongoing and interested applicants may apply at any time. The Trustees meet twice per year to consider applications. Applications must be made in writing and should include a stamped, addressed envelope if a response is required.

Historic England - Repair Grants for Heritage at Risk

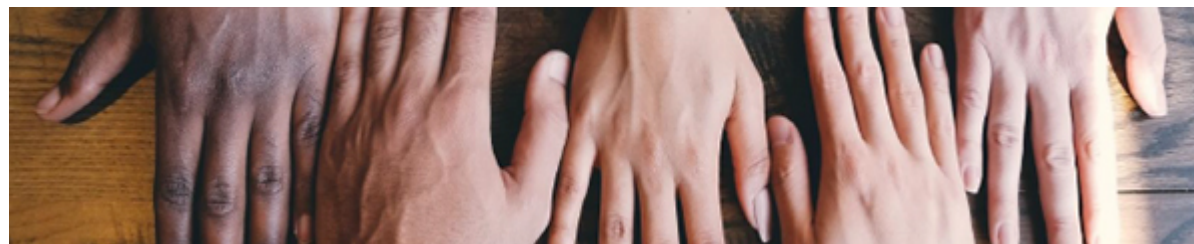
This scheme covers grants for the repair and conservation of listed buildings, scheduled monuments and registered parks and gardens. Grants are primarily awarded for urgent repairs or other work required to address risk by preventing loss or damage to important architectural, archaeological or landscape features. Hampshire Active Health Programme

The Hampshire Active Health Programme is providing grants to organisations working to encourage and provide physical activity opportunities in communities facing the biggest health inequalities as a result of Covid-19. Funding is available to not-for-profit organisations, local authorities, NHS trusts and primary care networks. Organisations must be delivering services to priority groups within the Hampshire County Council area. The deadline for applications is 20th December 2023. Arnold Clark Community Fund

Grants are available for UK registered charities and other not-for-profit organisations who need immediate financial relief and who are working for the benefit of the wider community. Biffa Award Main Grants Scheme – Rebuilding Biodiversity

The Biffa Award Rebuilding Biodiversity theme provides grants for conservation projects located within 15 miles of a significant Biffa Group Ltd operation or within 10 miles of a landfill site, with the aim of protecting and enhancing the environment so that it can adapt to threats such as climate change. Grants of £10,000 to £75,000 are available. The total cost of the project must be less than £200,000 including VAT. Please [CLICK HERE](#) to find out more.

Lush Charity Pot

Grants are available to small grass-roots organisations working in environment, animal protection and human rights, with priority for less popular causes that aim to create long-term change and struggle to find funding. The Million Hours Fund

Grants are available for not-for-profit organisations, schools and local authorities to provide extra support to young people (aged 11 to 18 years; up to 25 years with disabilities and special educational needs) who are at risk of anti-social behaviour in eligible areas of England. Toy Trust

The funding is intended for UK based children's charities who are working for the benefit of disadvantaged children under the age of 13 years and their families. Funding is available to help disadvantaged children aged below 13 years and their families to:

Weaver's Company Benevolent Fund

Through its Benevolent Fund, the Weaver's Company provides funding for smaller charitable organisations that are providing services for young people who are vulnerable and at risk of becoming involved with crime. The funding is intended to support work in the following areas of interest: Young offenders | Ex-offenders | Young disadvantaged people, especially those at risk of criminal involvement. The maximum grant is usually £15,000 per annum. Priority will be given to smaller organisations which offer direct services. UnLtd - Awards for Social Entrepreneurs

The funding is intended to support social entrepreneurs by helping them nurture their social ventures and grow their impact. Two levels of funding and support are available: Start Up, and Scaling Up, with different levels of funding. Cash4Clubs: The 2023 Fund

This year's focus is on community sports clubs and organisations who are in need due to the impact of the pandemic and the cost of living crisis and may be threatened with closure. Applications will be accepted from clubs and organisations that are either registered charities or clubs with a structured governance and constitution. While the funding is unrestricted there is particular interest in hearing from clubs that are using sport for other social purposes such as developing skills, reducing crime or addressing anti-social behaviour.
